



#### SIR celebrated its 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary on 7/23/23!

Some of you already know, the Sons in Retirement Foundation, Inc. (SIRF) was established in 2019 to collect and distribute funds for SIR members who suffered significant losses in the Camp Wildfire devastation of Paradise and Magalia. Through the generosity of individual Sir members and SIR Branches, the foundation collected and distributed over \$41,000 to victims of that disaster. Since then, SIRF has provided annually, Zoom licenses to support "Grants of Use" to SIR Branches wishing to hold meetings and activities online during and after the pandemic. The Foundation has other expenses as well, annual State of California fees and required liability insurance for non-profit organizations. The annual administrative costs total about \$1400.00 A purpose and goal of SIRF is to support the needs of SIR Branches and their members, and be prepared should an occurrence like the Camp Wildfire happen again. We also look to support other organizations for projects that make meaningful improvements to facilities and infrastructure benefitting the applicants' local communities. The Foundation is soliciting our support by encouraging us to make a donation, no matter how small, to replenish the SIRF coffers that are now essentially empty and allow them to maintain the Foundation and continue their ability to support our members and their branches with appropriate help when needed. Our branch will discuss a donation at the next BEC Meeting. We also encourage any individual who may want to donate, to do so. Attached (See last page of newsletter) is the Donation Form. SIRF, Inc. is a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation, so your contribution is taxdeductible within the limits prescribed by California law. SIRF is currently managed by a five-member volunteer Board of Directors. They invite an SIR member with fundraising experience to help the Board obtain donations that allows them to continue providing grants where needed or requested.

Carson Pforsich was born in 2000 to Andy and Andrea in Sebastopol. He was an athlete from an early age, playing basketball, baseball and football. He excelled in baseball and football at Analy High School and graduated with a 3.6 GPA.

On September 24, 2017, he was with friends at the beach in Bodega Bay. He dove over a wave and struck his head causing damage to his spine, leaving him paralyzed. His friends saw he was in trouble and removed him from the water.

It has been a long journey back from that accident. That journey included love and support from family and his girlfriend Desi, who he first met in kindergarten and who is a big part of his life now.

Carson has displayed determination and grit from the day of that accident. With the help of family, friends, dedicated doctors, physical therapists and three trips to Thailand for stem cell treatments, which have helped him greatly with strength and upper body function, he continues to improve every day and has a positive outlook that inspires all who meet him.

Today Carson is coaching football at Analy High School and working toward an accounting degree at an online college.




The Pacific Coast Air Museum is once again hosting Hot Dog Thursday on the first Thursday of the month April through October. The next one is **August 3rd**.
