Golf

Its winter and the holidays are here so more players, regardless of skill level, are desired. Come and join us on the course Wednesday mornings. Prior to Wednesday, use the signup sheet at the golf course or call the golf course at 707-838-7888 and sign up for SIRS golf. The starter usually gets us out by 8:00. *If you are new* to the golf group, please show up on time (7:45) and look for us. Since we look forward to playing with new members, we will certainly make adjustments to get you in.

2003 GOLF MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION:

You have the following choices:

- 1. If you want your handicap establishing and tracking you need a Northern California Golfing Association (NCGA). Without it you cannot play in SIRS tournaments, they have no way to rank you with others.
 - We make one exception to that. For our weekly sweeps you can still pay the \$5 sweeps fee and win prizes in the two closest- to- the -pin competition;
- **2.** You can establish your initial NCGA index (5 games) playing wherever as long as you report your score to NCGA;
- **3.** You can gain and keep your NCGA with annual membership fee paid to Windsor 176 golf club (US) or you can join or will have joined another club, for example, Windsor Senior Men;
- **4.** Whichever you choose to be your club, we will add \$10 to the annual fee to cover special sweeps, beer on the patio etc.

If you do not have an NCGA number you can get it through Windsor 176 golf. If you get it some other way please let us know.

FEES

Straight renewal with 176 is \$39 plus \$10 for prizes/special events. If you are renewing with another club, they will have their own renewal fee. We ask that you also contribute \$10 to 176 for prizes etc.

Fees for joining NCGA for first time, or after a prolonged absence, are \$49, plus \$10 for prizes etc.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

- 1. You decide what you are going to do (remember 176 needs 10+ renewals/signers.
- 2. You let Mike Berry know by email, ASAP.
- 3. You pay fee to 176, plus \$10 for prizes, or just \$10 to 176. Mike needs these by early January. When you email Mike he will give you his address so you can send payment.
