

My Profile: RICHARD DeLAMBERT



I was raised in Oakland, Ca. I spent a lot of time in growing up in Carson City, Nev. One side of my family is from Ely, Nev. And the other side from Salt Lake City. Originally my family came to Kansas from France. However, some went to New Zealand and Australia. My father's family lived in Sacramento in 1906 when my grandfather worked for Hillsbrother's coffee located what is now in front of the state capital. They moved from San Francisco in 1916 during the flu epidemic to Mill Valley where my dad and grandfather worked on the train which went up Mt. Tamalpais in Marin County.

I have thirty grandchildren who live in all parts of the Wild West. I was in the service at 5th Army Headquarters in Chicago in 1957 thru 1959 (the cold war) and was discharged in 1964. I attended Oakland High School, San Jose State and University of California.

I have played tennis all my life as well as playing and traveling for the US Army. My biggest tournaments were the US open and the national clay courts in Chicago. I enjoyed teaching tennis at Cardinal Newman High School. Also in the early days I coached younger soccer team and baseball teams. Additionally I coached and caught for the Army baseball team.

Professionally, I was a banker for 31 years. I started working in Montgomery Village for Hugh Codding. Next I went to work at Santa Rosa Savings. Finally, I became the district manager for Wells Fargo Bank. In 1992 I retired from banking.

While working in banking I also taught at Santa Rosa Junior College i.e. law, real estate and economics. Also, I was able to form the Visitors Convention Bureau for Sonoma County. Additionally, in 1987 I became president of the Santa Rosa chamber of commerce and in 1988 became president of downtown Rotary. I was in Rotary for 49 years.

After retirement I worked for both Kunde and St Francis winery. St Francis winery sent me to Italy to purchase a bell (\$75,000). Yes I am a bell collector with over 750 bells. Most of the collection is over 200 years old.

My biggest contribution to our community has been raising funds. For two years I was the United Way chairman of fundraising along with doing the same for one year in Sonoma. I am currently recruiting chairman for SIR 17 with an increase of 22 members in the last quarter of 2022. I now live in Santa Rosa with my significant other Faith Bredfeld.
