

I attended the SIR State annual meeting via Zoom on August 31st. There were 103 on-line participants. Dale Decker will be the next SIR president. Area governor will be Rich Provost. District 10 director Bob Nadell is stepping down after two years of State service and is seeking a replacement within the District 10 branch memberships. 94 percent of State income comes from branch member assessments. The current State balance is \$72,000.00. \$50,000.00 is required for State insurance. Sir State may have to increase the branch assessment level in order to pay for required insurance coverage.

I also attended the SIR Area 10 meeting via Zoom that was held on September 6th. Two branches are healthy. Branch 76 is down to 28 members and may merge with Branch 17. Branch 176 remains healthy. Outgoing Area 10 governor Bob Nadell has issued a final report which will be included in this newsletter.

Phil Anderson Memorial Bench: The proposal to provide part of the funding for a Windsor Golf Course bench in honor of Late SIR Phil Anderson, in the amount

of \$410.00 to be taken from the Golf fund with Golf Fund Manager Mike Berry's approval, was approved by the BEC on motion. The remainder of the funding has been paid for by WGC and the WGC Men's Club.

Elections: This slate was elected by the membership without any nominations of others being received at the membership meeting of September 20th: Big Sir Larry Doherty, Little Sir Tom Palmer, Secretary Dave Harrison, Treasurer Garry Trojanowski, Assistant Secretary Jerry Culver, Assistant Treasurer Howard Blethen, BEC one year members: Ed Peoples, Gary Jensen, and Tim Senkir; BEC two year members: Chris Roach, Wayne Lindahl, and Ward Thompson.



Jim graduated from UC Davis which led to his first career. The pandemic pushed our special


format golf tournaments into the background but we are back.


