A Sympathy card was sent to Pat McDermott on the passing of his wife. We are not aware of any services at this time.


Little SIR – Larry Doherty

STEPHEN LEHMANN

We will be welcoming Stephen Lehmann. Stephen and his wife moved to Windsor in 1978 to their home on Starr Road directly across the street from the Windsor Grange. Both of their sons were born in that house. In 1988 his family

moved, taking their house with them, to property located on the old Migrant Labor Camp and German POW Camp, west of town on Windsor River Road.

Stephen retired from the Sonoma County Recorder's Office in 2011 after 25 years. He was able to immerse himself in historic records of Sonoma County from pre-statehood to current times. His time with the Recorders Office following his degree in History from Sonoma State in 1972 was a perfect fit for his lifelong interest in history.

Stephen joined the Windsor Historical Society in 1991 and was president for 15 years. He was given the honorary title of "Town Historian" by the Windsor Town Council in 2009.


