I hate to mention it but....State SIR convened a Town Hall Meeting on June 24th to discuss the future of SIR. The state leadership believes that SIR is at risk of failure based on issues including:

- * Membership has declined from a state high of 30,000 to now 8,800 (Net -4%/yr.);
- * Member median age is increasing;
- * An increasing number of members are "aging out" and they are not being replaced by new younger members at an acceptable rate;
- * Volunteering is declining;
- *Many branches and the State are having difficulty replacing leaders.

A broad range of actions have been proposed to "save SIR". Some of the more serious ideas include:

- * A name and logo change. Take away the word "Retirement" and possibly "Sons";
- *Transition to 501(c)3 nonprofit, soliciting donations, and hiring an executive director, a digital marketing firm, and an IT firm.
- * In order to obtain desired donations, the Inclusion of women.

Our branch along with a few others (like out neighbor branch 17 in Santa Rosa) have been successful and don't realize most of these problems. However, the majority of other branches have not been so blessed, are a cause of SIR's decline, and are in need of revitalization. It follows then that what may be best for one branch, may not necessarily be so for another. Hence, reactions to these ideas have been mixed and discussions will continue; and I will do my best to keep you informed.

Meanwhile in our branch, volunteers have been coming forward to ensure continuation of our success (specific names to be announced later). To those who have or will be stepping up, a big "Thank You". To those who have been working/inviting folks so that we might gain more members.... again "Thank You".



Don McCorquodale

I was born on August 7, 1941, as a twin brother, in Sacramento, Ca. We moved to Spring Gap, Ca. when I was just one year old. My father was a powerhouse operator for PG&E. About two years later, the family relocated to Salinas, Ca and two years and after that to King City. Then in 1946 my family was involved in an auto accident that took the life of my twin brother. A while after that, my father was promoted to Electrical Supervisor causing us to move yet again, this time to Willits, Ca.

When I was 13 years old our family relocated one last time to Santa Rosa. I attended Slater Middle School and then Santa Rosa High School. While I was in high school, Montgomery High School was being built. I went there in 1959 for my senior year, making me a member of the first graduating class of Montgomery.

After graduation I went into the Sheet Metal trade where I worked for 4 years before becoming a journeyman. While still working in this trade I decided to join the Army Reserves. After 6 months of training, my service consisted of summer camp two weeks every year and meetings every month for the first four years. For the following four years I remained with the Army as inactive, only required to serve if there was a war. I retired from the Army in 1968. During these years I continued to work in the sheet metal trade; but most importantly, it was the time I meet the love of my life, Rogene Vartanian. We married in April 1965 at St. Eugene's Catholic Church and nine months later became proud parents to our son, Doug.

I retired from the Sheet Metal Trade and joined PG&E in 1967. In 1968 we had our first daughter Heather, and then our second daughter, Stacy in 1971. We all moved to our dream home in Northeast Windsor in early 1978. While continuing to work, I attended Santa Rosa JC in the evenings to earn my AA in Industrial Arts, graduating in 1969. Having worked my way up to a "Gas Technician", I retired from PG&E in 2001. By retirement my family had grown to include 4 wonderful grandchildren. Doug & his wife Zobida have a daughter and a son; while Heather with husband Paul having twin daughters. Stacy provided them with furry grand babes to love on.

After my retirement, for 20 years, I stayed busy running my own handyman business from which I retired in 2021. Life was not always work, work, work Rogene and I went on many cruises to see different parts of the world and also joined an RV Club to explore closer areas of the country. We really enjoyed our leisurely time together. I also liked to stay active by bowling and

playing bocce ball. When at home I enjoy watching a good ball game, whether it's baseball, football or basketball.

Rogene and I spent 58 years together before she passed from Alzheimer's complications in February of 2023. Currently, I like to be active by RVing with son Doug, bowling in his league, playing bocce ball, SIRS meetings and PG&E Retiree luncheons.



Youth and seniors can now ride free on SMART trains throughout Sonoma and Marin counties under a new pilot program that started April 1.

According to a recent announcement, the program runs through June 30, 2025, and allows youth 18 and younger and seniors 65 and older to board any SMART train, any day of the week and ride fare-free. Youth and seniors are not required to have a Clipper Card or to use the SMART eTickets app, to reduce any barriers to entering the transit system.
